COMMUNITY OVERVIEW

West Allis is a city with a rich industrial past and was home to the largest industrial plant in the state of Wisconsin for most of the 20th century. Since the late 1980's, West Allis has undergone a large-scale redevelopment, with a thriving small business culture, an eclectic downtown area, and an increasingly diverse population. It is a truly urban city (60,000 people in 11 square miles) with a small-town feel. It borders Milwaukee to the west and Waukesha County to the east, placing it right in between the city and the suburbs, which is one reason West Allis has become known as the "City at the Center." There is an east, central, and west side, and all are unique.

West Allis is home to Wisconsin State Fair Park, which is located in the center of the city along I-94 and draws a multitude of visitors every summer. State Fair Park boasts a lot of big events throughout the year, as well as one of only two Olympic Speed Skating Rinks in the United States. Our church is located on a thoroughfare just west of Highway 100, which is full of places to go and things to do. West Allis has 11 public elementary schools, including free pre-school, three intermediate schools, and two Division 1 high schools. The city boasts affordable housing and is a great place to lay down roots.

WHY PEOPLE LIKE LIVING HERE

People love being able to walk to their favorite local pub, restaurant, and park. They love the accessibility to all kinds of great destinations in Southeast Wisconsin, especially downtown Milwaukee and the lakefront. If you like professional sports, you can drive to see the Milwaukee Brewers or Bucks play within ten minutes. If you like food, West Allis is full of unique places to wine and dine. If you like festivals, West Allis folks love getting together for food, drinks, and live music. There is a great local Farmers Market and a plethora of shopping too. If you like outdoor fitness, there are bike trails in the city that lead into downtown Milwaukee or further west. Wisconsin is also home to some of the best State Parks in the midwest, full of lakes, hiking and biking trails, bluffs, and beautiful scenery, especially in the fall.

CHURCH HISTORY

In 1997, a group of people with a passion for the mission of Jesus Christ and the development of leaders started a new movement in Hales Corners, Wisconsin, called New Hope Community Church. New Hope began to grow and the church purchased a building in Franklin in 2000; a few years later we added to the building to make room for



more growth. In 2008 New Hope planted a church in West Allis called Fair Park Community Church, just down the road from Wisconsin State Fair Park. In the years following, New Hope developed plans to add to the building again in response to a desire to reach and serve more people. By 2013, though, God made it clear that the best way to do that was not to add on to our building but to move to more people.

The leaders of New Hope and Fair Park began spending lots of time together praying and asking God what He wanted us to do next. We determined that God wanted us to come back together as a new church with a new vision in the city of West Allis. This is how CrossPoint started, as a non-denominational church with our first service together on June 16, 2013 in Franklin. Within a few months, we sold our building and on February 9, 2014, we held our first service at West Allis Central High School. We learned and grew up a lot during the four years we met at Central, doing "portable church" for a second season. It was the right time for God to move us into the community to help, serve, volunteer, build relationships, and seek the welfare of our city. This is what we mean when we talk about being "On the Move."

In March of 2016 God provided an opportunity for us to purchase a property to call home again. The Goodwill store on Oklahoma Ave. had outgrown its space and was renovating a larger property across the street. We purchased the store and began working that spring. Within one year, a church of 150 people (that's us) and their friends built out 18,000 square feet. Except for the drywall and some of the carpeting, the people of CrossPoint put their own hands to work. God provided the money. God provided the strength. God protected our bodies. Without God's hand, we never would have made it to the starting line! We began meeting at our new location in May, 2017.

Since our grand opening, many new people and families have joined CrossPoint. Many have decided to follow Jesus and have been baptized. Many have become part of our family, and most of our growth has come from the community of West Allis. We learned a lot about ourselves during the pandemic, and even more about God's sovereignty. We believe God scattered the church for a reason, so more people can become followers of Jesus. Now that we are back together and growing again, we want to be bold, present, and intentional with everyone who walks through our doors, and to everyone God sends us.

VISION, MISSION, VALUES

Mission: CrossPoint Church is on the move to redeem people with the gospel of Jesus Christ. Values:

- Gospel Gospel means "good news." The gospel of Jesus is the power that brings people who are far away from God into His family. This gospel continually reminds us who God is and who we are. We express this by our preaching, teaching, and generosity.
- Relationships Relationships between people and families are where genuine love and commitment happen. We express this through thriving small group environments, and worshiping and serving together.



- Movement According to Jesus, we are sent to people who are far from God to draw them near, which means the church is always on the move. We show this by mobilizing people for service projects in our cities.
- Multiplication God made us learners, or disciples so that we can make more disciples. We are intentional about multiplying disciples of Jesus, as well as small groups, leaders, and more local churches. We show this through hands-on leadership development.

OVERVIEW OF WEEKLY WORSHIP GATHERING

We have one service at 10 AM that lasts about an hour. Each week, we have someone do a greeting, including any important announcements. This is followed by a contemporary worship set, usually three songs. The weekly messages are between 35-40 minutes. We aim to make every message about Jesus, and what God has accomplished through his life, death, and resurrection. We typically preach the Word through expository sermons with a view to Christ and the gospel, but we also preach topical series at least two or three times per year. Our people like the freedom to express themselves in worship, and our worship teams encourage reflection and celebration. Our people like the plain, clear teaching from the Bible, and we work hard to make each message engaging and personal.

WORSHIP STYLE OF YOUR CHURCH

The worship style at CrossPoint Church is best described as blended with a leaning toward contemporary. Our primary filter is and will always be what a song says about the truths of God's character and actions. We're more focused on how the lyrics lead us toward His gospel and greatness than if we are doing the most current and up-to-date songs. We aim to allow the most people to worship in the best way possible. Typically, that is accomplished through contemporary songs θ styles that people know and relate to, but we also bring in hymns regularly, usually modern or re-done versions.

TELL US ABOUT YOUR FACILITY

Our church used to be a Goodwill store, so it was a big empty box when we first walked in. By God's grace, we transformed it into a unique, functional place for people to gather and worship. The first thing you will see when you walk in is a large atrium with pub tables and a cafe/serving station. There is a comfortable seating area for nursing moms with a monitor for viewing the service there. Our kids' rooms are in the main area off of the atrium, and we have a mezzanine upstairs for our student ministry, The Loft, as well as for small groups, meetings, and parties.



There are two additional rooms upstairs for an office and storage. We have two large rooms on the west side of the building for CP Kids, including a half-gym, which is used as a basketball or pickleball court during the week. On the west side is our auditorium, which seats around 325 people. To the left of the main entrance is our office space, including a nice seating/meeting area, a conference room, and two offices. The building is 18,000 square feet total.

PUBLISHED THEOLOGICAL STATEMENT

We believe the Scriptures, both Old and New Testaments, to be the inspired Word of God, without error in the original writing, the complete revelation of His will for the salvation of all men and women, and the divine and final authority for Christian faith and life. The central focus of all Scripture is the redemptive work of Jesus Christ.

We believe in one God, Creator of all things, infinitely perfect, eternally and equally existing in three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

We believe that Jesus Christ is true God and true man, having been conceived of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary, He died on the cross for our sins, arose bodily from the dead on the third day, ascended into heaven, and is coming again.

We believe that the Holy Spirit indwells all believers in the Lord Jesus Christ; baptizes them into the body of Christ; convicts and reproves of sin, leads in the way of righteousness, and allays our fear of judgment; enables understanding of the Scriptures; empowers for Godly living; equips and gifts for service and witness.

We believe that God directly created Adam and Eve, the parents of the entire human race. They were created in His own image, distinct from all other living creatures, in a state of original righteousness. Adam and Eve, having been deceived, fell into sin, resulting in the fall of the entire human race. Consequently, all people are sinners by inheritance and choice, stand condemned before God, and are in need of salvation.

We believe that salvation is a free gift bestowed by God's grace and is received by faith in Jesus Christ. We believe that only those who put their faith in Jesus Christ as their personal savior are born of and sealed by the Holy Spirit and thus become children of God. We believe the shed blood of Jesus Christ provides the only ground for the justification of all who believe.

We believe a New Testament church is a local body of baptized believers, associated by covenant in the faith and fellowship of the gospel; observing the two ordinances of Christ; governed by His laws; exercising the gifts, rights, and privileges invested in them by His Word; and seeking to extend the gospel to the ends of the earth. Each church operates under the Lordship of Christ. In such a church, each member is responsible and accountable to Christ as Lord. Its scriptural leaders are elders and deacons. The New Testament speaks also of the church as the Body of Christ which includes all of the redeemed of all the ages, believers from every tribe, and tongue, and people, and nation.



We believe in two biblical ordinances for the church. The Lord's Supper is when all true believers reflect on and remember together the sacrificial death of Christ. Water baptism is by immersion soon after salvation and is a testimony of identification with Jesus Christ.

We believe it is our duty and privilege to make disciples of all nations. The Lord Jesus Christ has commanded the preaching of the gospel to all nations. It is the duty of every believer to seek to win the lost to Christ by verbal witness undergirded by a Christian lifestyle.

We believe in the blessed hope that Jesus Christ will soon return to this earth, personally, visibly, and unexpectedly in power and great glory to gather His Church, to raise the dead, to judge the nations, and to bring His kingdom to fulfillment. This blessed hope should have a vital bearing on the personal life and service of the believer.
