Community Overview

Located in the beautiful mountains of Eastern Kentucky, Prestonsburg is a small, rural hometown city. It is the county seat (Floyd County); and, as a result, see's a lot of visits from people in the county and attracts people from all walks of life.

Why People Like Living Here

Prestonsburg boasts a small-town family feel. We enjoy all four seasons of the year, and it is a great place to live for people who like the outdoors (hiking, biking, kayaking, hunting, fishing, golf, etc.,). There's also a great sense of pride in the community that centers around Church, schools, and sports.

Church History

Destination Community Church began in November of 2009. During this season, there were a group of twelve individuals who came together with a desire to make a difference in the Floyd County region. At the time DCC was started, a George Barna study showed that 90% of Floyd County (23,000 people) did not go to Church and have a relationship with Jesus.

From the very beginning, we wanted to be a place where no matter who you are, where you're from, whether you've been in Church your whole life, never been to a Church, or have been hurt/burned by the Church, you are in an environment where you are loved, welcomed, and the message of Jesus is very clear. DCC was started by our Founding Pastor, Lee Boyd, who served bi-vocationally in this role until 2016. From there, a full-time Senior Pastor was hired who served until December of 2019. Our current Lead Pastor, Jacob Dickerson began serving full-time in July of 2021.

Vision, Mission, Values

The Vision: A vision is a preferred picture of the future; it is an intended destination and where you want to be.

• At Destination Community Church, our vision is to lead people into a growing relationship with Jesus.

The Mission: If a vision is a preferred picture of the future, a mission is how we achieve that reality.

• At Destination Community Church, our mission is centered around three words: REACH people far from God, SERVE and meet physical/spiritual needs in our community, and GROW to become more like Jesus through small groups.



REACH:

- One of the primary ways we strive to REACH people at DCC is through our weekend services.
- During the weekend, we strive to create welcoming, hospital, Gospel-centered environment where people of all walks of life can come, worship, and hear about the God who loves them.
- We also strive to be intentional in what we communicate and how we communicate it, especially in our preaching. We are application driven, not information driven (that way ANYONE can identify what God wants them to KNOW, and what God wants them to DO), and we're always mindful that there will be non-Christians in the room; because of that, we strive to communicate in a way that everyone can understand, speak the language of the culture without compromising and being like the culture, and be a Church that unchurched people like to attend.
 SERVE:
- DCC isn't just a place where we gather together; DCC is a place where we GO together!
- Throughout the year, we host strategic events where we can SERVE our community, along with supporting ministries that are ALREADY doing a great work in our area.

GROW:

- At DCC, we're not just about doing ministry together, we're about doing LIFE together!
- As we gather together in small groups, we're able to develop relationships, ask questions about our faith, and grow in our relationship with Jesus in ways we can't do alone.

Overview of Weekly Worship Gathering

- We have two Sunday morning services at 9:30 and 11:15. Services are typically 60 minutes.
- Our worship style is contemporary, our preaching is conversational, and our atmosphere is relaxed and casual, with most people wearing jeans and a t shirt.
- We also have a first impressions team that serves on Sunday morning, which includes greeting, coffee bar, and information desk teams.
- Children's Ministry is offered at the 11:15 service, and Small Groups/Student Ministry are offered Sunday night at 6:00 p.m.

Tell Us About Your Facility

We are located in a 5,000 sq foot storefront building downtown. The entrance opens into a large lobby with a coffee bar, several tables, a kid's ministry check-in, and a guest service desk. This area is also used for food during fellowship events. We have two large kids ministry rooms and one nursery, and our auditorium seats 200.

Published Theological Statement

The following are the core beliefs of Destination Community Church based on the foundational truths taught in the Bible. All of our teaching and ministry is rooted in and flows out of these biblical doctrines.

God

God is the Creator and Ruler of the universe. He has eternally existed in three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. These three are co-equal and are one God.(Genesis 1:1,26,27; 3:22, Psalm 90:2, Matthew 28:19, I Peter 1:2, II Corinthians 13:14)

Eternity

People were created to exist forever. They will either exist eternally separated from God by sin, or in union with God, through forgiveness and salvation. When we die, we will either spend eternity in Heaven or Hell. Eternal separation from God happens in Hell. Eternal union with God occurs in Heaven. (John 3:16, I John 2:25; 5:11-13, Romans 6:23, Revelation 20:15)

Salvation

Salvation is a gift from God to mankind. We can never make up for his sin by self-improvement or good works. Only by trusting in Jesus Christ as God's offer of forgiveness can we be saved from sin's penalty. Eternal life begins the moment one receives Jesus Christ into his life by faith. (Romans 6:23, Ephesians 2:8-9, John 14:6; 1:12, Titus 3:5, Galatians 3:26, Romans 5:1)

Jesus Christ

Jesus Christ is the Son of God. He is co-equal with the Father. Jesus lived a sinless human life and offered Himself as the perfect sacrifice for the sins of all people by dying on a cross. He arose from the dead after three days to demonstrate His power over sin and death. He ascended to Heaven's glory and will return again to reign as King of Kings and Lord of Lords. (Matthew 1:22-23, Isaiah 9:6, John 1:1-5; 14:10-30, Hebrews 4:14-15, I Corinthians 15:3-4, Romans 1:3-4, Acts 1:9-11, I Timothy 6:14-15, Titus 2:13)

The Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit is equal with the Father and the Son as God. He is present in the world to make people aware of their need for Jesus Christ. He also lives in every believer from the moment of salvation. He provides the Christian with power for living, understanding of spiritual truth, and guidance in doing what is right. The Christian seeks to live under His control daily. (II Corinthians 3:17, John 16:7-13; 14:16-17, Acts 1:8, I Corinthians 2:12; 3:16, Ephesians 1:13, Galatians 5:25, Ephesians 5:18)



The Bible

The Bible is God's Word to all mankind. It was written by human authors under the supernatural guidance of the Holy Spirit. It is the supreme source of truth for Christian beliefs and living. (II Timothy 3:16-17, II Peter 1:20-21, II Timothy 1:13, Psalm 119:105,160, Psalm 12:6, Proverbs 30:5)

What theological hills will you die on?

- Salvation is by grace alone, through faith alone, in Christ alone (Romans 10:9-10).
- Baptism is for an individual who has a relationship with Jesus Christ and is a means of going public with their faith (Matthew 28:16-20; Acts 18:8; Acts 19:4-5).
- The Bible is the inspired, infallible, inerrant word of God (2 Timothy 3:16).
- Marriage is between one man and one woman (Genesis 2:24).
- While God has created man and woman with equal worth and value (Genesis 1:26), God has limited the office of pastor/elder to a man (1 Timothy 3:1-7; Titus 1:5-9), this including the teaching and preaching of the Bible during a weekend worship service.
