Community Overview

The DC Metro Area, also known as the DMV (D.C., Maryland, and Virginia), is a large metropolitan area with great wealth (5 of the top ten wealthiest counties in the US are in the DMV). The "city" we are located in is called Fairfax. However, it is more of a reference to Fairfax County, which consists of multiple suburbs that are all joined together. Fairfax is in the Northern Virginia area and is close enough to DC that there are several DC Metro stops in Fairfax. It is an extremely diverse population with highly driven people. While there is great wealth in Fairfax (the fifth wealthiest in the US), there is also extreme poverty (1 in 6 children are food insecure). The cost of living, specifically housing, can be a shock to people relocating here. Government contracting, military, and federal government make up a significant portion of the job industry here. Another shock to people relocating here is the traffic. Politically, Fairfax is more liberal than conservative. Spiritually, there is a wide array of faiths here from all around the world as well as many agnostics and atheists.

Why People Like Living Here

There is no shortage of multicultural experiences here. This is a historic region surrounded by civil war sites and close proximity to the nation's capital. The school system regularly ranks as one of the highest in the country, with a wide array of opportunities for students. The greatest part of living in Northern Virginia (NoVA) is the rich diversity of experiences and people here.

Church History

Expectation Church was founded in 1961 as Bethlehem Baptist Church in Fairfax, VA, with 35 members. In the church's 61 years of ministry, its current Senior Pastor is only the fourth Senior Pastor to hold the office. There have been a great many changes over the years, including two name changes (Fair Oaks Church in 2003 and Expectation Church in 2015), the opening and closing of a private Christian school, and several location changes. Though Expectation Church has a baptist heritage, it is non-denominational and not under the auspices of any outside governing church body. The current Senior Pastor, Christian Gaffney, has held the position for the last three years. In September 2019, the church moved into their new location within Fairfax - a 50,000-square-foot building with room to grow and be an asset to the community.

Overview of Weekly Worship Gathering

- We hold two identical services at 9AM and 11AM. The 11AM service is streamed live. Typically we have two songs, welcome/announcements, another song, the message, and conclude with a final worship song.
- The most common feedback we get about our atmosphere is welcoming and authentic. The pastor generally preaches in jeans and a t-shirt. We place a strong value on volunteer engagement (20% of our total attendance is made up of volunteers).
- Kids (birth through 5th grade) also make up 20% of our total attendance. Our children's ministry is called eKids
 Jr. (birth through PreK) and eKids (Kindergarten through 5th grade). eKids Jr. and eKids meet at the same time as
 the main worship service; however, it is common to see kids attend during the worship at the beginning of the
 service. Middle School and High School (eStudents) meet on Sunday nights from 5-7PM. All of our eStudents are
 encouraged to volunteer and attend the main worship service(s) on Sunday mornings.



Worship Style of Your Church

We have three or four vocalists, an electric guitar, bass guitar, keyboard, and drums every Sunday. The band plays a lot of Maverick City, Elevation Worship, Hillsong, etc. We are the fog machines and stage lights kind of church.

Tell Us About Your Facility

Our facility is three years old and we are debt free. The auditorium seats 888. We have a full technology suite to capture and live stream our services. The church sits on 42 acres of land, much of which is environmentally protected. We are in the process of theming our lobby, eStudents, eKids, and eKids Jr. spaces, as well as building a back patio to utilize for ministry in the coming years. We utilize a fairly open office concept with short cubicle walls.

We do not have any formal partnerships with any organizations. Historically we have been a part of the Baptist Bible Fellowship International, though we have not been for nearly twenty years. However, we do partner with several churches, community outreach organizations, and missions agencies. We have no denominational affiliation, however, we do have baptist roots.

Governance & Polity

- We have a Senior Pastor who works in conjunction with the associate pastors on staff. The Senior Pastor, associate pastors, and church staff are responsible for the day-to-day operations of the church. The church membership votes on any changes to the church bylaws, the annual budget, and the hiring of the Senior Pastor.
- There is a Board of Trustees that has fiduciary oversight of the church.
- There is a Fellowship of Deacons that consists of men and women who designate the financial giving of our church as well as provide support and advice to the Senior Pastor and associate pastors. We are working towards being more reliant on volunteers as part of our discipleship model.

Major Ministries of the Church:

- eGroups Our church has both a narrow and wide focus when it comes to our ministries. We have a wide focus in that we have a broad diversity of various ministries, however, we are also narrow in our focus because of how we facilitate those various ministries. For example, we do not have an established "men's ministry" or "women's ministry." Instead we have a single small group ministry called eGroups (hence narrowly focused). Within the small groups ministry there are men's groups, women's groups, service-oriented groups, recreational groups, and many more. This allows us to stay narrowly focused on small group ministry while also having a broad array of ministry outlets.
- eTeams Another way people connect with our church is through our eTeams. eTeams are volunteer teams that serve and lead various ministries on Sunday mornings and in our community. Some of our eTeams include our eKids, eKids Jr, and eStudents volunteers, hospitality, production, worship team, greeters (we call them connectors), online hosts, and prayer teams.
- Next Gen We also have a dedicated eKids Jr (birth through Pre-k), eKids (K 5th grade), and eStudents (6th 12th grade) ministry. This is largely volunteer-supported and led.
- Care Team, Prayer Team, and Counseling Teams We also have a care and prayer team which encourages the congregation with prayer, notes, and service projects as needed. Additionally, we are building a counseling team with volunteer professionals to provide counseling to our congregation and community.

Outreach Programs Overview

We have several community partners that we support financially and with service projects. These include:

- Fairfax FISH (For Immediate and Sympathetic Help) a network of churches that partners with the county to provide emergency relief to members of the community as well as case management.
- FACETS this is an outreach ministry that seeks to provide meals for food insecure and the homeless in our community
- Operation Christmas Child We have a big push each fall for OCC; last year we sent out nearly 1,000 shoe boxes.
- Feed Fairfax 5k This is a volunteer-led 5k in our community that our church largely supports. We support two local food banks with donations and meals each year.

Of The Scriptures

Of The Creation

Of The Church

We believe that a Baptist church is a congregation of baptized believers associated by a covenant of faith and fellowship of the Gospel, said church being understood to be the citadel and propagator of the divine and eternal grace; observing the ordinances of Christ; governed by His laws; exercising the gifts, rights, and privileges invested in them by His Word; that its officers of ordination are pastors or elders whose gualifications, claims, and duties are clearly defined in the scriptures. We believe that men and women are spiritually equal in position before God, but that God has ordained distinct and separate spiritual functions of men and women in the home and in the church. The husband is to be the leader of the home and men are to hold the leadership positions as pastors in the church. Accordingly, only men are eligible for licensure and ordination for pastor by the church. We believe the true mission of the church is found in the Great Commission: first, to make individual disciples; second, to build up the church; third, to teach and instruct as He has commanded. We do not believe in the reversal of this order; we hold that the local church has the absolute right of self-government, free from the interference of any hierarchy of individuals or organizations; and that the one and only superintendent is Christ through the Holy Spirit; that it is scriptural for true churches to cooperate with each other in contending for the faith and for the furtherance of the Gospel; that every church is the sole and only judge of the measure and method of its cooperation; on all matters of membership, of policy, of government, of discipline, of benevolence, the will of the local church is final. Of Missions

The command to give the gospel to the world is clear and unmistakable and this Commission was given to the churches. Matthew 28:18-20, "And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth. Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you and, lo I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen." Mark 16:15, "And he said unto them, Go ye into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature." John 20:21, "As my Father hath sent me, even so send I you." Of The Grace Of Giving

Scriptural giving is one of the fundamentals of the Faith. 2 Corinthians 8:7, "Therefore, as ye abound in every thing, in faith, and utterance, and knowledge, and in all diligence, and in your love to us, see that ye abound in this grace also." We are commanded to bring our gifts into the storehouse (common treasury of the church) upon the first day of the week. 1Corinthians 16:2, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him, that there be no gatherings when I come." Under Grace we give, and do not pay, the tithe - "Abraham GAVE the tenth of the spoils," - Hebrews 7:2,4 - and this was four hundred years before the law and is confirmed in the new Testament; Jesus said concerning the tithe, "these ought ye to have done", Matthew 23:23. We are commanded to bring the tithe into the common treasury of the church. Leviticus 27:30, "The tithe ... is the Lord's." Malachi 3:10, "Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in mine house, and prove me now herewith, saith the Lord of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it." In the New Testament it was the common treasury of the church. Acts 4:34,35,37, "And brought the prices of the things that were sold and laid them down at the apostles' feet ... Having land, sold it, and brought the money, and laid it AT THE APOSTLES' FEET."

Hot-Button Social/Cultural Issues for Your Church

- Marriage, as approved and designed by God, is between one man and one woman. Sexuality should be expressed, as designed, within the confines of marriage. So all people are welcome and invited to come to Expectation Church and we will strive to live out God's design for our lives regardless of our sexual orientation. Following Jesus is about surrendering, denying ourselves, to follow Him. We should surrender to His design, creation, and intent for our lives, and that is what the Christian life is all about.
- Traditionally our church has taken a cessationist stance (Baptist roots), but we have many continualists in our church. All things should be done in a good and orderly way in accordance with Scripture. We do not publicly speak in tongues unless we know there is someone who can interpret the message (which we have never identified). As far as other gifts of the Spirit, God can give any gift He wants to, but it is His providence.



- As far as women as pastors, again, we seek to be faithful to the Scripture in everything we do. So at Expectation Church women serve as deacons and in several leadership roles but not in the office of pastor.
- We live in a very purple area with strong beliefs on both sides of the political spectrum. It has been preached several times that we are not trying to espouse the ideas of either the left or the right but the cross. We have a very diverse congregation in many ways including politically.

- We have baptized 51 people in 2022 so far. Up from 46 in 2021.
