Church History

- 1991 Keystone was established by Pastor Steve O'Dell, his wife, and their young son.
- 1993 Keystone grew steadily from a family of three to a congregation of close to 70 people by 1993.
- 1994 Pastor Ken Gilmore was the second staff member hired in 1994 to run the Student Ministry and assist in other ministries. We became a fully established Wesleyan Church in the East Michigan District of the Wesleyan Church International.
- 2000 -7.5 acres of land on Saline Waterworks Rd. was purchased with cash and construction began on our new facility.
- 2002 -Keystone's building was officially opened on Waterworks Rd. We ended the year with an average attendance of 215.



- 2006 The founding Pastor of Keystone resigned to pursue a new ministry opportunity and the membership of Keystone Church voted unanimously to elect Pastor Ken Gilmore as the Senior Pastor.
- 2009 Keystone was invited to become a Strategic Partner of North Point Ministries in Atlanta, Georgia, and maintained that partnership until 2012. Our experience as a partner church helped us develop methods to more effectively reach our community and implement systems for greater church health and growth.
- 2009-2010 Keystone's average attendance grew to over 600.
- 2013 Keystone launched our 3rd Experience at 11:40 AM.
- 2014 Keystone capped off the year with the largest Christmas Eve attendance we have ever experienced as over 1,000 people joined together in two worship experiences to celebrate the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ. This same year Keystone once again experienced a first in our 23-year history with 1033 people in attendance at our three Easter Sunday worship experiences.
- 2015 Keystone capped off another year with over 1,000 people in attendance at our Christmas Eve experiences and a \$25,000 offering that was given away to missions work in Iraq.
- 2016 Love Where You Live: Keystone seeks to grow our positive impact in the world, both near and far, through strategic missional partnerships, both near and far.
- 2017 Keystone marks its 25th Year of Ministry and served over 1,200 people at our Christmas Eve experiences with a \$42,000 offering that was given away to mission work at Hope Clinic in Ypsilanti and Samaritan's Children's Home in Bangladesh.
- 2020 Covid downsize services held in Tents outside for the summer
- 2021 New building expansion project started.
- 2022 Building project completed and paid for in full.

Denominational Affiliation and/or other Partnerships

We are a member of The Wesleyan Church and part of the Great Lakes Region therein. At the present time we have no other affiliations or partnerships. We often utilize North Point Ministries in Atlanta resources as we had previously partnered with them. Historically we have utilized the Orange curriculum. Prior to 2021 we were members of the Willow Creek Association.

Governance & Polity

The ministry operations are headed and managed by the Lead Pastor. The Leadership Team serves as a "board of directors" in assisting the lead pastor with major decisions regarding key operational issues and developing ministry vision and implementation. As a Wesleyan church, Keystone follows the Wesleyan Discipline for its governance. The



lead pastor is the default chairman of the church board (known as the Keystone Leadership Team, or KLT). Additionally, the KLT contains six lay members who fill the roles of vice-chairman, treasurer, secretary, and members-at-large. The board meets monthly unless circumstances require more frequent or special meetings. The following excerpt from the Wesleyan Discipline (section 781) provides an accurate description of how Keystone operates:

• The local board of administration governs the local church primarily by (a) clarifying its mission and stating the primary outcomes it exists to achieve; (b) setting guiding principles within which the pastor and staff have great discretion and freedom to work in order to achieve the mission, including the adoption of operating policies, the budget, and measurable, annual goals proposed by the pastor for accomplishing the mission. The church holds an annual meeting at the beginning of each fiscal year (June) where reports are presented and members vote to approve the annual budget. Members also vote on the purchase and sale of property and the calling of a lead pastor.

Major Ministries of the Church

- Waumba Land is our ministry for children from birth through Kindergarden. Their mission is to incite wonder in the heart of every child. We want to help preschoolers embrace a God who is bigger than their imagination.
- UpStreet is our ministry for kids in grades 1-5. In UpStreet our goal is to instill three core principles based on the life of Jesus, 1) I need to make the wise choice, 2) I can trust God no matter what, and 3) I should treat others the way I want to be treated.

Overall Description of this Position

We are looking for a lead pastor with the spiritual gifts of leadership and teaching, led by the Holy Spirit, who can encourage and guide our staff and volunteers to develop the ministry at Keystone into one that challenges our congregation to become committed disciples of Christ who are willing to follow God's calling to be His hands and feet to a broken world.

Goals and Expectations

Our main goal and expectation in the next year would be for our new lead pastor to get to truly know our staff, leadership team and congreation, and based on that knowledge: provide vision and direction as to how to more effectively move our ministry forward in making disciples, bringing new people to Christ, and serving the community.

Do you have a job description for this role?

Personal Qualities

- Committed and mature follower of Jesus Christ with a disciplined life characterized by consistent, deep, and regular prayer; daily time spent reading, studying, and meditating upon God's Word; and continuously growing and developing sanctification.
- Demonstrates a personal passion and commitment for evangelism, outreach, apologetics, and discipleship, with evidence thereof in their personal life. If married, must be deeply committed to their family and maintain healthy boundaries on behalf of their family.
- Person of integrity, holiness, and trust
- Meets the biblical qualifications of an elder as outlined in Scripture (Acts 20:28; 1 Tim. 3:1–7; Tit. 1:6–9; 1 Pet. 5:1–4).
- The lead pastor should clearly seek to build and invest in relationships, especially with the people the pastor is responsible to lead (e.g., Keystone staff).



Professional, Educational, and Ministry Qualities

- Must fully embrace the Bible as the inspired and inerrant Word of God, aligning with historical orthodox and Wesleyan theology.
- Excellent record of leadership success in a local church setting, preferably as a lead pastor.
- Strong preference for a candidate who has served a minimum of five years in a local church with multi-level staff, ideally in a multi-campus setting.
- Sound theological education from a reputable seminary; a graduate degree that includes training in biblical languages (Greek and Hebrew) is strongly preferred.
- Proven track record of, and experience with, mentoring and discipling staff to make them more effective leaders, helping staff members formulate detailed written plans and goals for their respective ministries, and lovingly holding staff members accountable thereto by means of open communication and regular evaluation.
- Commitment to, and prior experience with, increasing the congregation's overall biblical literacy and fostering a community of disciple-making disciples (2 Tim. 2:2) passionate to fulfill the Great Commission (Matt. 28:18–20).
- Passion for partnering with children's, elementary, middle school, and high school ministries, and supporting such ministries with adequate resources and encouragement from the pulpit, to ensure that future generations know the life-changing power of God's Word (Deut. 6:4–9) and the gospel.

Pastoral Qualities and Roles

- Community Engagement
 - This person will be a relational leader who values partnership development and intentional community engagement. The lead pastor will communicate the vision of the church to the community as well as investing in, and building partnerships with, other local churches, local businesses, and local government.
- Enthusiastic Alignment with the Church's Mission and Core Values
 - It is essential that the lead pastor is excited and in alignment with the stated mission of the church. The lead pastor must also wholeheartedly believe and lead in the practice of the stated core values. The lead pastor will exemplify the mission of Keystone Church—"To love and lead people in a growing relationship with Jesus Christ."
- Effective Preacher/Teacher
 - The lead pastor should be able to clearly and passionately communicate biblical truth through sermons connecting believers and non-believers. Sermon presentation should be sensitive to the unchurched who are part of our congregation. In addition to being exegetically grounded in the authority and text of Scripture, messages should be creative, engaging, filled with practical application, and presented in such a way that the people find them motivating, challenging, helpful, and convicting. Sermons should spark passion, action, and be relevant to all ages. As needed, sermon messages should incorporate scientific, historical, philosophical, and other evidence undergirding the Christian worldview, to appeal to non-Christians as well as Christians (Col. 4:5–6; 1 Pet. 3:15).



- Reliable and Faithful to Commitments
 - In addition to the congregation as a whole, the church leadership views the lead pastor as faithful to commitments and decisions. The lead pastor should be a person who can be relied upon to have deep integrity.
- Competent in Facing Challenges and Conflict
 - The lead pastor should be faithful, dependable, and even-keeled in challenging times. Tough conversations, including addressing conflict and holding staff accountable, should be managed in a timely manner with grace and kindness, speaking the truth in love.
- Demonstrates Dependence on the Holy Spirit
 - The lead pastor must demonstrate an eagerness to invite the Holy Spirit to be released in great power as well as demonstrate an eagerness to depend on the wisdom of the Holy Spirit (James 1:5–6) in leading the ministry of the church.

Leadership Qualities and Roles

- Leader
 - The lead pastor must have a demonstrated gift of organizational leadership. This includes, but is not limited to, leading and equipping the board, mentoring and discipling members of the staff team, handling finances wisely, providing vision and guidance, and the like. The lead pastor must be committed to leadership development in others; the lead pastor's leadership should make others better.
- Collaboratively Develop, Cast, and Implement Vision
 - The lead pastor must have experience with and be effective at all phases of setting vision for the church and must be willing and able to operate with others in a collaborative approach.
- Staff Leadership
 - The lead pastor must have experience effectively leading a multi-person staff. This will be demonstrated by the ability to direct staff, form a cohesive team, empower staff in the execution of their responsibilities, and guide staff to develop their personal areas of giftedness in an accountable manner.
- Consensus Building: A Leader Who Will Form, Equip, and Lead Teams of Leaders
 - The lead pastor will equip the staff, the board, other leaders in the church, and the congregation in a collaborative spirit. The lead pastor should be able to lead assertively and yet demonstrate flexibility within reasonable boundaries to achieve "ownership" from the teams in an effort to achieve common goals.
- Effective Vision Communicator: Communicates in a Compelling Manner
 - The lead pastor should be able to communicate clearly and passionately, both in writing and verbally, to large and small audiences. Communication should be timely and informative. Feedback should be solicited regularly so communications can be corrected, clarified, or repeated as needed. Communication to the staff, the leadership of the church, and the congregation concerning vision and future direction should be motivating so that people desire to be a part of where the church is going.



- Follow-through: Carrying Tasks to Completion
 - The lead pastor must ensure that follow-through happens on decisions that are made. It is not necessary that the lead pastor personally carries those tasks to completion, but it is necessary that the lead pastor recognizes the importance of follow-through and oversees the staff and church leaders in an efficient and accountable manner to carry out tasks.
- Courageously Opportunistic
 - The lead pastor must be willing to try new and innovative things, take obedient risks, test new waters, and pursue the church's mission in creative and yet responsible ways. This should be done in the context of being a consensus-building leader and as a networker with peers outside the church to leverage the collective wisdom of others facing similar opportunities.
- Intergenerational Ministry
 - The lead pastor must be committed to reaching multiple generations and finding ways to reach all generations. Importantly, in the context of youth ministry, the lead pastor must therefore be committed to ensuring that parents and guardians are adequately trained and discipled so that they are equipped to fulfill their sacred responsibility of raising the children under their care to know and love the Lord.

Educational Preferences

Sound theological education from a reputable seminary; a graduate degree that includes training in biblical languages (Greek and Hebrew) is a plus but not required.
