Community Overview

We are located in a growing suburb of the capital city, Des Moines, Iowa. Altoona specifically is growing at 2.5% annually. The school district (Southeast Polk) is a regional school district serving 5 different towns (Altoona, Runnells, Pleasant Hill, Mitchellville, and parts of Des Moines). The school district was the 13th largest in the state in 2021-2022 with 7,025 enrolled.

Why People Like Living Here

The Eastern side of the county, including Altoona and surrounding communities, while seeing growth in business development, industrial development, and residential development, still has a small-town feel. Altoona is home to many restaurants and entertainment venues, including a state-of-the-art theater, aquatic center, amusement park, horse racing, and many outdoor recreation opportunities. We are also the home to an outlet mall, Bass Pro Shops, and a growing development around the Outlet Mall. Within a short drive of the city, you will find water recreation (lakes and rivers) and parks for hiking, camping, and playgrounds. It's just a short 10-minute drive to downtown Des Moines with many cultural, shopping, and dining options. Being part of the capital city means easy access to a larger metropolitan area while still being able to live and work in a smaller community. There are lots of options for kids to be involved in sports, arts and recreational activities through both the schools and community partners.

Church History

In 1984, a group felt called to plant a Lutheran church in Altoona. Their original location was a floral shop in the business district. In 1985 they purchased a home that would serve as their office and meeting space and is still used as our offices today. Under the direction of the founding pastor, a multipurpose/worship space was added along with 4 classrooms in 1986. In 1989 the founding pastor resigned and Pastor Mark VanderTuig was called as the Pastor. He led the congregation for the next 20 years. Within this time, the facilities grew with 4 additions, including expansion of the then worship space, two learning center expansions, and the addition of the current Worship Center and our secondary building, Cross Creek. In 2002, the church voted to leave the ELCA, and joined as a charter member of LCMC. In 2010, Pastor VanderTuig resigned to take a role with LCMC. At that time, average weekly attendance was 1000. Over the next two years, the church engaged the services of Metanoia Ministries for an intentional interim period to help the church evaluate their current positions and structure and create a profile for finding our next Senior Pastor. In 2012, Nathan Anenson was called as our next Senior pastor. In recent years, the church has implemented strategic discipleship language, developed an in-house seminary partnership, and repositioned themselves to be a greater blessing to their local community.

Overview of Weekly Worship Gathering

We gather at three services each weekend: Saturdays at 5:30pm and Sundays at 8:30 and 11am. All gatherings are designed with relevant, engaging, and inspiring music and messages. While embracing the modern, we hold on to the best of the ancient and re-teach the foundations of our faith. It is our desire that as we gather with each generation present, each person has a life-changing encounter with the Living God. Each worship gathering is led by a full band, with a seamless flow between each movement of the service. Music is upbeat, whether it's a hymn or the latest song on the radio. Most songs are new/modern songs while including one hymn each weekend. Preaching is planned out in a message series, and is engaging, relevant to daily life, done without notes so it feels more conversational, and most importantly, grounded in God's word. People appreciate the upbeat, fresh feel of the services, while holding on to key components of our ancient faith (hymns, Lord's Prayer, Confession & Forgiveness, responsive readings, etc.) People also appreciate the real-life application of God's Word in the messages.

Worship Style of Your Church

Our worship is welcoming, and energetic contemporary Christian music is played while people gather in the Worship Center. The Worship Leader welcomes the church and invites people into a time of worship with a full band through three songs and other spoken components. Music includes selections from Hillsong, Bethel, Vertical, Phil Wickham, and other modern artists, as well as traditional hymns done in a modern format. Songs are selected based on theology, theme, and congregational sing-ability. There is then a warm welcome, announcements, and a video transition into the message. Messages are approximately 25 minutes. The Lord's Supper is served 2x/mo. We finish with another song and a sending. We value both excellence and participation; both the communal and the personal connection with God in worship; both well-planned and Spirit-led.

Tell Us About Your Facility

Our church began meeting in a house in 1984 and has been built over several phases since that time. Therefore, none of our buildings, aside from the original house structure that we use as our offices, is more than 35 years old. We have two buildings on one piece of land separated by a storm water drainage creek. The main building has a fellowship hall (which was our original worship space), a learning center (12 classrooms used by kids, youth and adults), and a Worship Center (pew seating to accommodate 700). The second facility houses our weekday preschool (faith based, open to community), a large meeting/community room, and 5 classrooms. The main building square footage is 31,600, and the secondary building square footage is 10,500. The main worship space opened in 2001 – the remainder of the main building was built on in phases from 1989-2005. The secondary building opened in 2005.

Denominational Affiliation and/or other Partnerships

We are part of Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ (LCMC). LCMC is grounded in Lutheran theology, puts authority in the congregations (not in a hierarchy), takes the Great Commission seriously, and is grounded in Christ and His Word. We are not officially affiliated with other networks, but do work with Alpha, Emotionally Healthy Discipleship, as well as other groups as it fits our mission and DNA.

Governance & Polity

Decision-making is delegated throughout the organization. Jesus is the cornerstone and the Lord of the church. Members are the ministers and serve as part of the body of Christ in a variety of roles, including Ministry Teams. Staff are called not to do the ministry of the church, but to coach the members and Ministry Teams and equip them for ministry. Specific ministry decisions are made within the Ministry Teams. Staff provides guidance and coordination between the different ministries. Staff members are accountable to the Sr. Pastor and the Sr. Pastor is accountable to the Governing Board. The Board provides overall vision and discernment for the church and stays out of the day-today ministry. They also provide overall fiscal responsibility (in coordination with the Finance Team), as well as overall policy development. The congregation elects the Governing Board, approves the annual budget, and calls pastors.

Major Ministries of the Church

- Alpha: an opportunity for people of all ages and backgrounds to explore faith in a safe and friendly environment. Includes a meal, a message, and small group discussion.
- Adult Groups: We desire to be a church in which everyone is connected. Groups help foster our UP, IN, and OUT relationships. These groups happen Sunday mornings, as part of a class, and throughout the week in homes.
- Adult Connections: Mid-size gatherings to help people connect and take the next steps in their faith (women's events, 55+ monthly gatherings, etc.)
- Kids: Each Sunday, 90 kids gather with 30 leaders for building great relationships and high-energy music and skits—all aimed at helping multiply practical faith in our kids. Other creative outreach/family events are planned throughout the year.
- Youth: Each Wednesday night, 70 youth gather with 20 leaders for pizza, great conversation, and large group teaching to make practical faith real in their everyday lives. An annual mission trip also takes place every summer.
- Care Ministry: Counseling, visits, Divorce Care, Grief Share, etc. all help people find Christ in their crisis.
- Outreach: A significant focus on hunger alleviation through a variety of partnerships and projects. We also bless about 10 partner ministries with volunteers and funding.
- Worship: A great team of servants who give their time and gifts of singing, playing instruments, and facilitating A/V, to create an environment in which the Holy Spirit can meet with the church. We also have a seasonal choir.
- Hospitality: A great team of welcomers, providing a smile, a hello, and coffee, and donut holes. We also have a Security Team.
- Weekday Preschool: A highly rated, Christ-centered preschool with great outreach into the community.

Outreach Programs Overview

Seven years ago, we conducted a research project of our wider community, looking at demographics and interviewing leaders in government, education, and business, as well as our local ministry partners, to see what the needs and

opportunities were in our community. Through that process, we launched a significant outreach to alleviate food insecurity in the name of Jesus. We also took the next steps to leverage our facilities as a community center for our wider Community. Currently, we are doing this research project again and look forward to what God will show us next as to how we can partner with Him in what He's already up to in our wider community. We have numerous ministry partners (both locally and globally) that we generously support financially (over \$120k/year) and with volunteers. The church is regularly encouraged to invite friends and family to worship and other events so that we can multiply the practical faith God has given us. We have done parties in the park and have empowered neighborhood block parties to help provide space for our people to build relationships and share their faith.
