Church History

The first Church meeting for New Hope Fellowship was held at the home of Daren Bowen under the leadership of founding pastor Norm Smith in 1994. As the church continued to grow, a permanent location was sought but never found. New Hope has met in a variety of locations in and around Hampstead and Westminster, ranging from senior centers, schools, armories, and even the airpark. For 12 years the church rested and rented at one location – Westminster airpark. In 2013, we left the Westminster airpark location and began renting space at Carroll Lutheran School. We finally landed at our home in June of 2019 with the purchase of the old Roops Mill on route 140. In late 2021 our pastoral search, beginning in 2020, culminated with the arrival of Pastor Nick Dunn. Amidst all the moves and changes you might ask "Who is New Hope?" In this new season of ministry, we would tell you that we are an equipping ministry that is all about making Disciples in a healthy church environment.

Overall Description of this Position

We are looking for a Family Pastor to lead the Next Gen team at New Hope. This person will oversee all areas of Family Ministry associated with New Hope and work in tandem with the Lead Pastor to disciple, empower, and engage families.

Reporting Relationship

The Family pastor will report to the Lead Pastor. Though qualified to serve on the Elder team, they will not be a member of the Elder team.

Goals and Expectations

In the first year, we would love to see them further develop and expand the youth ministry footprint at New Hope. Other goals include:

- Empower and work alongside our two part-time staff members in the family ministry area: Nursery Director & Kids Director
- Raise up a healthy volunteer team to serve in youth ministry.
- Develop a healthy youth ministry rhythm for New Hope = Curriculum, events, meeting times etc.
- Start to build relationships in the community and other churches to understand how to best engage, equip, and empower families.
- Think through and develop a way to provide resources to parents and to provide care for marriages in crisis.
- Own all pre-martial counseling and any martial counseling (work with Lead Pastor on this).
- Map out a systematic approach to disciple families / Outreach to engage the community.
- Plan and execute a marriage weekend seminar.
- Build relationships within the congregation.
- Preach on occasion (minimum 4 times annually with potential to preach more).
- Pastor on call on Sunday mornings helps welcome guests, specifically families.

Job Description:

NHF desires to make a lasting impact in the Westminster community by leading people to become fully devoted followers of Jesus Christ. The Family Pastor will work diligently to develop this role taking the initiative to jump headfirst into a fast-paced, evolving ministry environment.
