COMMUNITY OVERVIEW

Santa Maria is located along California's beautiful Central Coast. The City of Santa Maria is the largest and most populous city in the County of Santa Barbara, with more than 110,000 residents. The unincorporated area of Orcutt, adjacent to the southern portion of Santa Maria, is home to over 32,000 residents. Santa Maria is located 70 miles north of Santa Barbara and 30 miles south of San Luis Obispo, about halfway between Los Angeles and San Francisco. The city is surrounded by ocean breezes, mountains, fruit and vegetable fields, and over 30 wineries. Our community is known for its world-famous Santa Maria Style tri-tip Barbecue.

The racial/ethnic breakdown of Santa Maria is 76% Hispanic, 15.4% White, 1.2% Black, and 6.6% Asian or other, and the racial/ethnic breakdown of Orcutt is 62% White, 28% Hispanic, and 10% All other. Only 48.5% of Santa Maria residents identify as religious. While agriculture remains a major industry with many sophisticated infrastructure expansions, Santa Maria and the unincorporated areas enjoy a vibrant economy based on a healthy combination of commercial and manufacturing development, education, oil production, the local public airport, and nearby Vandenberg Space Force Base. The daily average temperature is 72 degrees.

WHY PEOPLE LIKE LIVING HERE

Santa Maria offers big-city amenities with a small-town sense of community. Residents like our cultural diversity, central location ("close to everything"), and ease of travel. Outdoor recreational activities abound. Local housing is relatively affordable compared to other parts of the state. Our medical facilities and schools earn high marks. Fresh local produce is accessible year-round. Residents rave about our Santa Maria Style Barbeque and authentic Mexican food.

CHURCH HISTORY

Orcutt Presbyterian Church began as the original Christian fellowship in the southern part of the Santa Maria Valley through the ministry of an itinerant evangelist and Presbyterian pastor, who began church planting here in 1904. The fledgling church opened the doors of its first sanctuary in 1907. Over the years, we have participated in several different Christian traditions and continue to welcome believers from a variety of backgrounds. In 1941 we officially affiliated with the Presbyterian and Reformed stream of the Christian faith. Our current sanctuary was completed in 1994.



We have been fortunate to enjoy long pastorates in our senior pastors. Rev. Robert Wedaa served for 25 years, from 1969-1994. Our current pastor Rev. Bruce Lethbridge has been serving OPC since 1996. As of April 2014, we have been part of a newer denomination that seeks to be a movement that makes disciples of Jesus Christ and plants churches. The movement is called ECO: A Covenant Order of Evangelical Presbyterians. We seek to be a community of faith, hope, and love that points people to the Lord Jesus Christ who alone is our Savior.

VISION, MISSION, VALUES

OPC seeks to be a community that is building hope and restoring lives through the transforming power of Jesus. We strive to encourage one another as brothers and sisters in Christ and to equip Christ's people to practice their faith by loving God and our neighbors in tangible ways. Toward this end, we invite people to meet Jesus Christ, connect with others, grow in faith, and serve in Jesus' name. We have identified strengthening our outreach, welcome, and assimilation ministries and developing a discipleship pathway as priorities for the next few years. We are seeking a pastor to join us in improving these areas as we continue to follow Jesus.

Our church values the following:

- Bible-based teaching We come to know the one true God and whom He sent by teaching and learning the Bible book by book, verse by verse. By this, we learn that we are a part of God's story and find our place in that story.
- Authentic relationships We are called to be a community of one mind and body of Christ, and to love our neighbors. We are called into relationship with God and each other. Through sharing Christ's love and compassion with each person, we build authentic relationships.
- Power of prayer In everything we give our praises, thanks, and requests to God our "Father," who hears and answers our prayers.
- Children and youth We seek to make a difference in the lives of our children and youth by building an atmosphere of love, support, and opportunity for young disciples to live for and serve Jesus.
- Community service and outreach We are called to love our neighbor, which can only be accomplished if our inward focus turns outward by sharing the gifts, talents, and resources God has given us.

OVERVIEW OF WEEKLY WORSHIP GATHERING

We offer two in-person worship services (contemporary and traditional), with a combined service once a month. The majority of our covenant partners enjoy the blended service and the shared meal afterward. A live stream is available. Preaching is expositional. Our music is both praise and hymnal. OPC strives to connect with our neighbors and community through developing authentic relationships. We seek to meet people where they are and help them



to move forward in a life-changing journey of faith that is centered on meeting Jesus Christ and serving in His name. People like our strong Bible-based teaching, friendly reception, relaxed atmosphere, and opportunities for involvement. Many worshipers share their talents and gifts during Sunday morning ministries.

WORSHIP STYLE OF YOUR CHURCH

Most weeks we are in two services:

- The Gathering informal, primarily contemporary praise music
- Legacy semi-traditional, mostly hymns.

We have a full band in our contemporary and blended services.

TELL US ABOUT YOUR FACILITY

The OPC campus covers 3 ½ acres in the middle of a neighborhood of family homes. Our spacious sanctuary can seat 607 persons; it houses a small prayer chapel. An adjacent multi-purpose fellowship hall has a stage area and full kitchen. The "Ark," a building off the east parking lot, is the hub for children's and youth ministries and activities. Another building houses the OPC Food Pantry and Clothes Closet. We serve those in need in our community through weekly distribution of food (in partnership with the Foodbank of Santa Barbara County) and clothing. In addition to our courtyard, there is also a large grass area used for activities and outdoor church services on occasion. Our campus is a multi-purpose facility utilized by many community organizations.

We are an Evangelical Covenant Order of Presbyterians (ECO) denominational church. We partner with Stephen Ministries. Our mission support budget is 10% of our overall budget.

GOVERNANCE & POLITY

Our congregation is governed by a session, consisting of elders duly elected by and from the covenant partners of this congregation, along with the congregation's installed pastors, associate pastors, and in accordance with the congregation's own rule assistant pastors who have been elected by the congregation. The congregation determines the number of elders, their length of service, and the ordering of the session.



CURRENT PAID STAFFING LEVEL

We currently have a full-time senior pastor, full-time office administrator, part-time choir director, part-time technical support person, part-time business administrator, and part-time facilities maintenance tech. We also have two open positions at present: a part-time children's ministry director and a part-time pianist/accompanist.

MAJOR MINISTRIES OF THE CHURCH

Our major ministries are Worship Services, Bible Studies, Children's Ministry (grades nursery-6), Youth Ministry (grades 7-12), Stephen's Ministry, Food Pantry, and Clothes Closet.

OUTREACH PROGRAMS OVERVIEW

The Food Pantry is a well-known community outreach. Our mid-week Bible studies often attract people from outside our church.

Though the majority of the congregation leans conservative, we have a variety of folks in our congregation.
