Community Overview

Shiloh Community Church, while in itself is in a rural setting, has plenty of places to go and things to do and see. Church History

Shiloh Community Church can trace its beginnings all the way back to the early 1890s. It was formally reorganized and named Shiloh Community Church in 1958 after calling Pastor Ken Harger to be its first pastor. Shiloh experienced slow and steady growth over the years while being led by Pastor Ken. At one point, Shiloh Community Church's weekly attendance grew to around 1,000 people across four services. Through several pastoral transitions from 2010 - 2021, the church struggled to regain this momentum. In 2021, Shiloh Community Church called its current senior pastor, James Floyd. Shiloh has begun to experience new growth and health. We are reaching new families and have deepened our commitment to living out the Great Commission in our community.

Overview of Weekly Worship Gathering

We offer three distinct worship experiences on Sundays. Our 9:00 AM service features more traditional music led by 4-5 singers, a piano and an organ. This service is mainly attended by seniors and empty nesters. Our 10:45 AM service features music led by our praise band. We also offer our Shiloh Kids ministry for children, nursery through 5th grade. Our 6:00 PM service offers contemporary music with an acoustic feel. This service is scheduled with our Shiloh Student ministry's youth group time. The teens are in the service for the worship music and communion before going to the teen center in the basement for their teaching time. The same sermon is preached in all three services, although the order of service varies.

Our church currently offers three distinct worship experiences: traditional, contemporary, and acoustic contemporary. The majority of the growth of our church is happening in our contemporary service.



Tell Us About Your Facility

Shiloh Community Church has been blessed with three properties that provide great ways for us to love our neighbor and share the Gospel. Our ministry center features an auditorium that seats 400, open-concept children's classrooms, a gymnasium, a commercial kitchen, and a youth space in the basement. These facilities are dated, so we have recently created a team to prioritize repairs, improvements, and new construction. We are in the early stages of creating a master plan which will include a new family ministries wing. Shiloh Community Church also owns a 37-acre campground which we use for our Shiloh Kids day camp during the summer and a Live Nativity during the winter. We also own and maintain the Long Lake Playground in order to provide a safe place to play for the children who live near Long Lake.

Major Ministries of the Church

Shiloh Community Church is committed to growing our ministry to families by strengthening our Shiloh Kids Ministry (nursery through fifth grade) and Shiloh Students (sixth grade - twelfth grade). These ministries offer weekly programming on Sundays: Shiloh Kids during our 10:45 AM service and Shiloh Students during our 6:00 PM service.

Published Theological Statement

The Word of God: We believe that the Bible is the Word of God, fully inspired and without error in the original manuscripts, written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, and that it has supreme authority in all matters of faith and conduct. (II Timothy 3:16; II Peter 1:20,21; Mark 13:31; John 8:31,32; John 20:31; Acts 20:32)

The Trinity: We believe that there is one living and true God, eternally existing in three persons, that these are equal in every divine perfection, and that they execute distinct but harmonious offices in the work of creation, providence and redemption. (Genesis 1:1,26; John 1:1,3; Matthew 28:19; John 4:24; Romans 1:19,20; Ephesians 4:5,6)

God the Father: We believe in God, the Father, an infinite, personal spirit, perfect in holiness, wisdom, power and love. We believe that He concerns Himself mercifully in the affairs of each person, that He hears and answers prayer, and that He saves from sin and death all who come to Him through Jesus Christ. The Holy Spirit: We believe in the Holy Spirit who came forth from the Father and Son to convict the world of sin, righteousness, and judgment, and to regenerate, sanctify, and empower all who believe in Jesus Christ. We believe that the Holy Spirit indwells every believer in Christ, and that He is an abiding helper, teacher and guide. (Genesis 1:26; 5:2; Genesis 3; Genesis 2:17; 3:19; Eccl. 2:11; John 3:14; 5:24; John 5:30; 7:13; 8:12; 10:26; Romans 9:22; II Thessalonians 1:9; Rev. 19:3,20; 20:10;14,15; 21:18; Psalm 51:7; Jeremiah 17:9; James 1:14; Romans 3:19; 5:19; Proverbs 28:13; I John 1:9; John 3:16; John 1:13; II Corinthians 5:17; Romans 8:1)

The Ordinances: We believe that the Lord Jesus Christ has committed two ordinances to the local Church: baptism and the Lord's Supper. We believe that Christian baptism is the immersion of a believer in water into the name of the triune God. (Matthew 28:18-20; Acts 2:38-39; Romans 6:3-5) We believe that the Lord's Supper was instituted by Christ for commemoration of His death. We believe that these two ordinances should be observed and administered until the return of the Lord Jesus Christ. (Acts 2:42; Acts 20:7; I Corinthians 11:23-26)

The Church: We believe in the universal Church a living spiritual body of which Christ is the head and all regenerated persons are members. We believe in the local Church, consisting of a company of believers in Jesus Christ, baptized on a credible profession of faith, and associated for worship, work, and fellowship. We believe that God has laid upon the members of the local Church the primary task of giving the gospel of Jesus Christ to a lost world. (Ephesians 2:19-22; Acts 1:8; Ephesians 5:19-21; Acts 2:36-42; Hebrews 10:23-25)

Christian Conduct: We believe that Christians should live for the glory of God and the well-being of others; that their conduct should be blameless before the world; that they should be faithful stewards of their possessions; and that they should seek to realize for themselves and others the full stature of maturity in Christ.
