We are nestled at about 2400 feet in elevation in the Sierra Nevada Foothills between Sacramento and Lake Tahoe. Nevada City and Grass Valley are home to numerous galleries, museums, and unique shops. There are many activities and events year-round, including numerous markets and festivals. Our small- town feel is enhanced with a rich cultural life full of art, music, entertainment, live theater, history, and fine dining. We enjoy four moderate seasons - each of which is incredibly beautiful.

Why People Like Living Here

This is a great place to live because you get to have the sense of small-town living with the enjoyment of being close to so many different activities. You'll find arts and cultural opportunities, abundant outdoor recreation, and some great schools, including the Nevada County campus of Sierra College. There are lakes, rivers, and streams for water play and fishing, and dozens of trails for hiking, biking, and exploring. Our community has a small-town feel with cultural diversity and warm, friendly people. The outdoor activities are seemingly limitless, with hiking, biking, skiing (both water and snow), boating, rafting, etc. Above all, the friendly and welcoming attitude of our residents are why people want to settle and enjoy life here. We are a short 45-minute drive to Rocklin and Roseville for major shopping centers and eateries.

Church History

- In 1991, six families sensed God's call to start a new church in Western Nevada County, California. The name Twin Cities was chosen to represent the vision of being a church for all people living in Western Nevada County. Twin Cities was a distinction given to Grass Valley and Nevada City during the gold rush days and the courageous people who started Twin Cities wanted the church to be community-minded in its ministry focus.
- In October 1991, the church extended an invitation to Ron Thompson to become the first pastor of this new church. On March 1, 1992, the church held its Grand Opening service at Gold Run Elementary School in Nevada City, and 158 people attended that day.
- The new church was well received by the community and quickly outgrew the facility in Nevada City. In 1998, a lease was negotiated to move to Grass Valley utilizing the Veteran's Hall and Hennessey Elementary School each Sunday. The church continued to reach people who were looking for a fresh and new experience with God.



- The church was finally able to buy 20 acres of land on Rough and Ready Highway, and after 13 years of being a "church in a box" the people moved into their new facility on Father's Day, 2005. Twin Cities continues to be about reaching their community and serving them in Jesus' name. They want to be people who learn to love God completely, love people deeply, and serve sacrificially as Jesus did.
- Today, Twin Cities is one of the more influential churches in Nevada County. The leadership of Twin Cities is committed to strong and practical Biblical teaching, passionate worship, following Jesus and reaching out to their community in ways that draw people into a growing relationship with Jesus

- Our facility is 17 years old, but it's in great shape. Our goal has been to keep it looking "new" and "fresh." We have a vision for our lobby that makes it more than just a pass-through zone, but instead, is a place to hang out. We have seating, a fireplace, and a coffee bar. We also use it as a multi-purpose room for events and activities.
- Our auditorium was built to accommodate 950 chairs. We currently have 700 chairs in place. We have recently updated our video, audio, and lighting abilities.
- We have classrooms for children with their own multi-purpose room for Sunday gatherings. Students have their own multi-purpose room for Sunday gatherings.



- We just completed installing new flooring in every place except the main auditorium.
- We have recently updated and repainted the walls throughout most of the building.
- We have beautiful, well-maintained landscaping with a water feature, and a cross people see as they come onto our property.
- We have a serene prayer garden with a water feature and place to be still with God.

We are "accepting" instead of "affirming" when it comes to the current sexual trends and gender misidentification we see around us. We encourage them to join us and explore faith in Jesus in a safe environment.

Overall Description

The Lead Pastor will be the primary communicator while casting vision and deploying resources to accomplish the mission of the church.
